AMBULANCE CRASH FATAL IN BROOKLYN

Interne Killed, Another Hurt— Policeman, Patient Shaken in Trolley-Car Collision

A physician was killed and another was injured at 10:45 o'clock last night when a Unity Hospital ambulance in which they were transporting a patient suffering from heart disease and under oxygen treatment was in collision with a trolley car in Brooklyn. The patient was not hurt.

The dead physician was Dr. Nathan Rabison, 28 years old, and the injured one is Dr. Sidney Nadelson, 26, both internes at Unity Hospital. Dr. Rabison died of a fracture of the skull. Dr. Nadelson was taken to Beth-El Hospital with cuts of the scalp and other injuries.

Patrolman Dominick Gerardi, 38, attached to the emergency squad of the Miller Avenue precinct, who was administering the oxygen to the patient, Morris Chrap, 68, of 483 Cleveland Street, Brooklyn, was shaken up, but went home after treatment. The patient was taken to Kings County Hospital in the same ambulance, which was only slightly damaged.

The police said the ambulance was going south in Sutter Avenue, in the East New York section, when it collided with the trolley car at Rockaway Avenue. None of the half-dozen passengers in the trolley car, operated by Harold Levey, 36, of 2826 Fulton Street, Brooklyn, was hurt, nor was the ambulance driver, Louis Sullivan of 102 Cumberland Walk, Brooklyn.

How the accident came about was not determined, and no arrests were made. Officials at Unity Hospital said they were unable to give further information on the identity of the two physicians.
